PETER BROWN FIELD TRIP SCHOLARSHIP FUND REQUIREMENTS

- Grants will be made available to grades preschool 12 in public and non-public schools.
- Preference will be given to those schools with a low-income percentage greater than 30%.
- Preference will also be given to those with clearly defined agriculture goals and class units and those who have not participated in a Wagner Farm program.
- Applications must clearly show that Wagner Farm field trips and outreach programs align with the State Learning Standards and/or Common Core Standards.
- Teachers may apply individually or collaboratively. Please send in ONE application if applying collaboratively.
- The school principal or district superintendent must sign the application showing support of the field trip.
- All applications must show a detailed budget showing field trip expenses
- Applications for a fall field trip must be **postmarked by October 1, 2024 or sooner**. Applications for a spring field trip must be **postmarked by March 31, 2025 or sooner**.
- Applications are good for the 2024-2025 school year (September 2024-June 2025).
- Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- Funding will be distributed based on the amount of funding available in the current fiscal year.
- Grant award notification will be given within 30 days after receipt of the application, based on the funds available that year.
- Grant funds must be applied to an onsite field trip or outreach program by June 2025.
- The Final Report and Field Trip Evaluation are due no later than <u>two weeks</u> following the date of your field trip.

2024 – 2025 School Program Offerings

A visit to Wagner Farm is not a trip to a petting zoo. It is an opportunity to see and participate in the daily activities of a real working farm. Our active teaching methods and hands-on activities encourage students to discover the connections between producer and consumer and the past to the present.

The following are the onsite ONLY field trip options:

Five Senses on the Farm

You may have seen the farm before, but have you seen, smelled, heard, touched and tasted it? Through hands-on activities, games, and songs, our youngest visitors will use their five senses to explore. They'll meet animals, learn about chores, and discover some of the food the farm produces.

Grade Level: Pre-K – K

Program Length: 75 minutes

Min / Max: 20 / 60 Availability: Year-round

In District / Out of District Cost: \$5 / \$6

Pastoral Pastimes

In the 1920s, kids living on farms were expected to work, but they also had time to play. Explore local history during this fun, semi-customizable program. Kids can help out with farm chores, play games, explore the farmhouse, meet chickens, make butter, and more!

Grade Level: Pre-K – High School

Program Length: 75 minutes – 2 hours

Min / Max: 20 / 120

Availability: Spring, Summer, Fall In District / Out of District Cost:

Moo-ving About the Farm

Let's get a moo-ve on! There's work to do! Learn about the different jobs people and animals have on the farm during this introduction to agriculture. Students will meet animals and take part in hands-on activities like grinding corn, feeding chickens, and making butter.

Grade Level: K – 2

Program Length: 90 minutes

Milking Cows and Pulling Plows

Cows, and horses, and chicks, oh my! Students will milk cows, groom horses, and collect eggs, all while exploring the historic and modern roles of livestock in our society.

Grade Level: 2 – 6

Program Length: 2 hours

Availability: Spring (mid-March – early June) and Fall (mid-August – mid-November)

Passport to the 1920s

Step off the bus and back in time! During this immersive experience, students will learn what life was like on a 1920s farm. They'll care for the farm animals and complete the daily domestic chores, including cooking their own lunch on a wood-burning stove.

Grade Level: 4 – 8

Program Length: 3 hours

Min / Max: 20 /25

Availability: Year-round

In District / Out of District Cost: \$12 / \$13

Near and Far

On average, food travels about 1,500 miles before it ends up on our plates; but this hasn't always been the case. By comparing modern food sources to those 100 years ago, students will learn the importance of being educated consumers and gain a greater appreciation for their food, all while meeting animals and getting their hands in the dirt.

Grade Level: 4 – 12 Program Length: 2 hours Min / Max: 20 / 75

Ag at Your Door
