#### **CSA Basics**

CSA stands for **Community Supported Agriculture**. It is a fun, economical way to buy local, fresh produce while supporting your local farm and our youth educational opportunities. As a member, you will receive different varieties of produce each week from the end of June through the beginning of October.



## WHC

Wagner staff farmers, student farmers, volunteers, and agricultural interns plant, grow, and harvest the food for your CSA. Much of the planning, planting, growing, harvesting, and packing is done by students. It is opportunity for them to experience the work that goes into food production and to learn agricutlural skills.





## WHAT

We grow over 100 different varieties of fruits and vegetables on the farm. For \$500 for the whole season you can get 15 baskets of fresh, locally grown produce. CSA members also have the option of adding our farm fresh eggs to

their produce share for only \$6/dozen!

## WHERE

You will pick up your CSA each week during the 15 week season at Wagner Farm's Heritage Center, located at 1510 Wagner Road. Pickup days are Tuesdays and Fridays from 3-5pm.



#### AS A CSA MEMBER...

you are agreeing to share in the bounty and the potential loss of our farms market crops. We promise to do our best to provide you with a plentiful share each week. The quality and quantity of produce may vary due to extreme weather, insects, or other factors despite our best efforts. Refunds are not given for crop failure. If we experience a bountiful year, you will receive more in your baskets. The first and last baskets will likely be lighter as we start up and close down harvest.

#### **OUR GROWING PRACTICES...**

We have gone through Produce Safety training to comply with current regulations. We try to stick with organic practices as much as we can, but we are not a certified organic farm. We do try to limit any pesticide use, but if it comes down to the bugs winning, we may spray that particular crop in order to save it. Feel free to ask us about our farming techniques and feel free to come visit, see the produce growing and tour the garden. We love hearing your input about your baskets and the creative ways you find to use all of the produce.
